made it possible to diagnose and treat the rare inherited disorder earlier than ever before. More important, it will allow development of tests to diagnose noninherited arrhythmias in the general population and use existing treatments more effectively, Bristol-Myers Squibb said.

Unlike Capecchi's financial award, which is intended for personal use, the grant to Keating is meant to help finance research in his laboratory for the next five

Capecchi was one of three winness of this year's Kyoto Prizes. The other two also went to Americans: Stanford University's Donald Ervin Knuth for his pioneering work in microcomputing and computer programming, and Harvard University's Willard Van Orman Quine, described as "one of America's pre-eminent 20th century philosophers."


