There will be more to disburse as soon as I receive refund on cancellation of fire insurance policy, also when we receive money from sale of cemetery lot in Austin, and anything else that might show up.

Also want to thank you folks for the box or oranges and grapefruit that came this week. They are delicious and we appreciate them ver much. Our manager at Pocatello sent us some baking potatoes, and our manager at Jackson Miss sent us some grapefruit pink from Texas, and a Navy friend in Santa Paula Calif sent us some dates, and our manager in New Mexico sent us some peanuts, so we are really be well remembered. Mary and Cyril sent us some Wisconsin cheese, also.

Well I have a busy schedule ahead of me. I will leave here night of Jan. 3rd for Omaha will be there the 5th, 6th and 7th and by plane to Wash. D.C. there the 8th, 9, 10, 11 and home in time to take over a school at Univ. of Utah Jan. 17th to 28th inclusive.

I will probably be named State Director of Selective Service of Utah by our new Governor and go back on duty in the Navy, but stationed here in Salt Lake City. It may last indefinitely and so will probably dispose of our agency. Incidentally in figuring the above I am deducting \$10.00 for the childrens disease policy I had issued for your kids, so that my check to you will be \$144.08.

Again thanks for everything and will be writing you I hope in few days with a little more money.

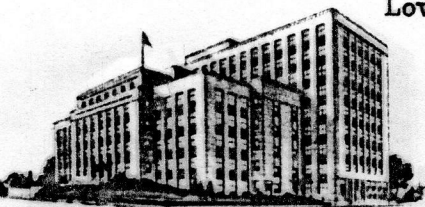

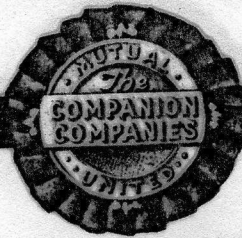

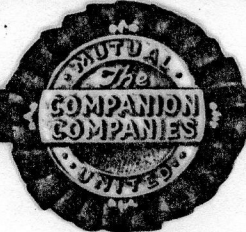

Again best wishes for the new Year and we hope this finds all the family in good health.

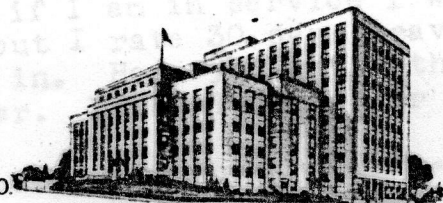

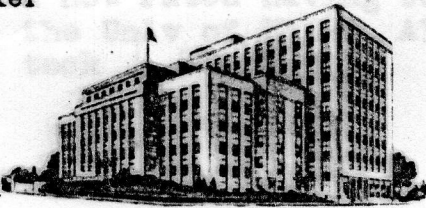

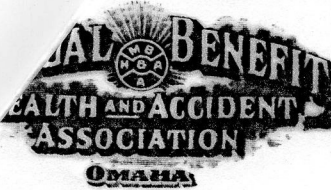

Your letter just received and the signed note and I am mailing to you herewith my check for \$400.00 and will ask you to forward \$10.00 or more each month until paid in full. I am enclosing herewith a duplicate note for your records and ~~also~~ you can enter each payment you make on the back of it.

Since my return I have been real busy, I sold \$62,500 of life insurance last month working from March 1st to 10th and then last week for four days.

Now I have a lot of money due me in all directions, small amounts and big and I try and collect some every day.

I reported on my new job April 1st and it will be a five day a week job, so I will be working on Saturdays mostly on my own affairs. I think I will like my new work very much. It will take me out over the state quite a bit. When I go on official business they furnish me a Plymouth car to drive.

I was in Mexico three or four times while in San Diego. I sent you a card from the resort hotel at Ensenada which is about 80 miles down the coast south of San Diego. That part of Mexico is mostly rolling country, the highway runs close to the ocean. Tia Juana has grown a lot since I was there last, which was about ten years ago. It is cleaner looking also. Of course it lives off the American visitors. They have what is called "Frontenon Palace" and which is a mammoth Jai Alai exhibition hall. I spent one evening there. The contestants were mostly Basque and Cubans. They played well and there is a lot of exciting betting on the various contests. They played singles and doubles and the final feature game was for 21 points with two teams playing doubles. It was the first time I have ever seen the game played. I think I would enjoy watching it frequently.

Hope you can get all your dental work taken care of and that the new car will be up to your expectations. Sounds to me that you people keep awfully busy. By the way I was invited to take a insurance class for a term for the Univ. of Utah, but declined. I have been out to take one lecture period two or three times this year, also put in two weeks in January conducting the a&H course at the Univ. of Utah. So I am now rated having been Lecturere in both life and a&H insurance for the Univ of Utah. Also considered an ex-student because of the work I took in extension. Love,

Dear Mary & Lincoln:

Your recent letters to Ruth and I both received also the \$10.00 payment. Thanks a lot! I credit your note each month paying principal and interest. The first month \$8.00 principal and \$2.00 interest, second month \$8.04 principal and \$1.96 interest, the interest will go down 4¢ each month and principal up.

Well your strenuous activities are a marvel to me. I do hope that the trip to Guatemala will be a rest. It should be with congenial friends like Frances along and being away from the family will do them and you good, and I know your being with Lincoln will help him a lot. It sure is fine that Frances can go, she likes to travel and also likes to get away from the rather set routine of her life in Austin.

I have been taking a lot of short trips here in Utah seeing everything there is to see when I visit each county. Most of the spots I had seen before but am enjoying seeing them again and finding new ones. Have wanted Ruth to go with me, but she has been busy nearly daily on our church Womens council work, she is president, just ended her term, is now vicepres, and the new president is gone for a month or so, so she still acts.

On May 28th we did leave for a three day trip into southeastern Utah, went first night to Green River, stayed a motel, next morning went south 6 miles where the only cold water geysers in this country exists. It comes up from an abandoned oil well about every 45 minutes and shoots nearly 100 feet in air. Then on to the Arches national monument north of Moab, then on to Blanding Utah, and visited a cliff dwellers ruins. Stayed at motel there, and next day south to Bluff and then Mexican Hat and visited the Goosenecks on San Juan river, where the river bends back and forth going 25 miles in an airline of 7, then south to Monument Valley just inside Utah from Arizona, where some recent movies have been made, then back to Monticello, Utah, at motel. Next day we took in Dead Horse Point on Colo. River, about as scenic as Grand Canyon and then home. About 1000 mile trip. We had two cars, and eight adults and four children, and really enjoyed it a lot.

A week from today I leave by car for Wash. D.C. Ruth will go with me, to attend our directors conference and we will be able to go via Erie, Pa. and visit Mary Frances family, also will attend wedding in Denver, June 18th of Bob McMinn, who just graduated in pet. engineering from Colo. School of Mines, he is marrying an airline hostess, who is forced to quit work under company rules when she marries, so it must be love.

Will arrive back here about 4th of July, so will be busy every day until I go. Sounds like you have a houseful of animals, but am sure girls enjoy raising the rabbits, provided they do not get out of their pens like ours used to do part of the time at Austin. I see by Texan that Dr. Battle has finally completely retired, also they are naming the new language building Casis Hall.

Dear Mary & Lincoln:

Your newsy letter came and appreciate your description of your Xmas activities. Too bad the college professors have to schedule their professional meetings for that period, as I know Lincoln has to be to many of them. I think it is wonderful though that he has had such fine recognition and shown leadership in his field. He is really quite an extrovert and should be a salesman instead of a college professor or Dean or Dept. Chairman!

I notice that you are expecting us out in January and I wish we could come but some things have happened since we saw you last that have changed the entire picture.

We have a new governor, J.B. Lee (republican) all of our other state officers elected were democrats, and it has developed that I will probably be named State Director of Selective Service for Utah. This means I go back on duty in the Navy, stationed of course right here in Utah. It is too good a thing not to take it. It is work I like to do and have had a long experience in. It would also probably mean my promotion to Captain in the Navy reserves, 4 striped same as Colonel in the Army.

It would also help qualify me for larger retirement by the Navy. They now have a retirement program at age 60 for reserves and national guard officers who serve 20 years or more and who had active duty in World War I or II. I have 17 years service and only need three more and by going back on duty it would build up my pension.

So I have decided to take it. I will attend the inauguration on Jan. 3rd and then leave for Omaha to confer with our home office on the change taking along the men who want to take the agency over and try and work it out there, and then fly to Wash. D.C. to confer with General Hershey and the Navy Dept. about my appointment, promotion, etc. I will be back about Jan. 13th and then will have a strenuous time getting my affair in shape, also I have agreed to conduct a two week school at Univ. of Utah Jan. 17th to 28th inclusive on Accident & Health. So no trip in January. In the future if I am in service I will have to guided to service requirements but I rate 30 days leave a year, so we should be able to squeeze it in.
