

Returns From War Service

Commander F. Edward Walker, USNR, has been released from active duty by the Navy, following five and one-half years service, and has returned to his desk as manager of the Walker Insurance Agency, Salt Lake City. During his absence Mrs. Walker took over the agency management.

A veteran of World War I, Commander Walker was a member of the Naval Reserve, and was called to duty early in 1940. He served as recruiting officer, officer procurement, and in Liaison with selective service. He was also stationed overseas in the South Pacific on advance base duty. He has been awarded the Naval Reserve Medal, the American Defense Medal, World War I Victory Medal, World War II Victory Medal, and the American Theater Medal, also the Pacific-Asiatic Medal.

Commander Walker is a C.L.U., and a past president of the Salt Lake Life Underwriters, Utah State Life Underwriters, Utah Life Managers, and vice-president of the Utah Accident & Health Managers Club. His civic and church activities include service in the Salt Lake Chamber of Commerce, on the Community Chest, with the Utah Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution. He is also a member of the Masonic Order, and chairman of the Central Christian Church, Salt Lake City.
